Synopsis: Having followed the market for the work of Louis C. Tiffany and Tiffany Studios, Arlie Sulka has observed a continuing and growing interest among old and new collectors. Since the mid-1950's when the late Mrs. Lillian Nassau almost single-handedly created the revival of interest in Tiffany Studios, the important works of Tiffany Studios have steadily appreciated as collectors have become increasingly sophisticated and as more detailed information about Tiffany Studios has been revealed by Tiffany scholars. During her talk, Ms. Sulka will make comparisons of prices when the objects were first offered for sale by Tiffany Studios with their present-day values, tracing their increases over the past 6 decades and describing how great Tiffany collections are being formed today.

### Botticelli, Leonardo, Michelangelo and the Antique



**Speaker:** Rocky Ruggiero, PH.D. Art History Professor and Italian Renaissance Expert

**Synopsis:** This lecture will explore the relationship between ancient Greco-Roman art and the then contemporary Renaissance artists Botticelli, Leonardo Da Vinci and Michelangelo; and how three distinct antiques -the Medici Venus, the Equestrian Statue of Marcus Aurelius, and the Laocoon -each became the inspiration for respective Renaissance masterpieces -the Birth of Venus, the never-realized Equestrian monument of Francesco Sforza, and the Sistine Chapel ceiling.
